"God's Work, Our Hands." For those of you who have been hanging around ELCA churches, you probably recognize the tagline of the ELCA. You also may be aware that the second Sunday of September has become known as "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday. There are some years when we as a congregation try to have a special project or two that we can do in service to the community. Some years we try to coordinate with other ELCA churches in the area to do something together.

This year, God's Work, our Hands Sunday happens between two events that we've been planning for a few months. The first one happens on Saturday, September 7. We and the other ELCA churches in Reno and Sparks are hosting a booth at the Pride Festival. Our goal is simple, to remind people that God loves them and letting them know that there are churches who welcome them, just as they are. By doing this jointly with the other congregations, it highlights who we are as ELCA Lutherans.

The second event is our Rummage Sale. Starting on September 8, you are invited to bring the treasures that you want to have sold at the Rummage Sale, which will be on Saturday, September 14. We are looking for help to set up on Friday, the 13<sup>th</sup> and to help work the event on the 14<sup>th</sup>. The primary goal of the rummage sale is to serve the community around us. We open our doors and we let people find things they need for inexpensive prices, and in this time period, inexpensive is good, right? It also lets the community know that we are here, and we strive to be a safe place that welcomes everyone.

There's a third event that we'll do later in September (the 29<sup>th</sup>), and that is the blessing of our quilts and knitted and crocheted items that will be shared with the community. While the items that we bless are certainly a blessing to so many, it's always a marvel to me just how God works beyond our quilts and handmade items ... for more about that, you'll have to hear a sermon in a couple of weeks that I'm already working on.

The reality is that we do God's work with our hands all the time. Our congregation is blessed by so many wonderful people, with huge servant hearts and that enables us to bless so many others. And even those who are unable to help as they want to keep us going with their encouragement, support and prayers. I am so grateful to minister with you.



We look forward to hearing about this great project at Natchez, celebrating and honoring Native American women. The skirts connect the wearer to Grandmother Moon and Earth, they are a symbol of women's sacredness, Native survival and identity.
